



#### **OUR ETHOS**

We believe that all children deserve an education rich in wonder and memorable experiences, alongside the purposeful acquisition of skills and knowledge. We believe that an education that does all of this gives children the best chance to become well-rounded, happy individuals, ready to succeed in an ever-changing world. Our ethos is that no child is left behind, and experienced early years practitioners work tirelessly to identify and address barriers to learning.

#### **ENVIRONMENT**

At Devonshire Pre-school, you will notice a calm environment. A neutral space accented with well-thought-out resources purposely placed to support and extend children's learning. We enhance our play spaces regularly by reflecting on the children's progress, skills, and specific interests.

An enabling environment provides children with the space and resources to play, explore and learn. The environment is a crucial aspect of our offering at Devonshire Pre-school. It is widely evidenced within the Early Years as a key factor in supporting children's learning and development.



## **PRE-SCHOOL HOURS**

Our pre-school is term time only (not open during the school holidays).

We open at 8.40 am and close at 3.15 pm Monday to Friday.

## **Lower Pre-school – Forest Class**

Children begin Lower Pre-school the term after their 3<sup>rd</sup> Birthday. They will then continue their learning journey through to our upper pre-school. Lower pre-school have access to our extensive environment as well as the school trim trail, sensory room, professional dance classes and regular balance bike practise.

## **Upper Pre-school – Jungle Class**

Children begin Upper Preschool the September before they are due to start school. In addition to the lower pre-school activities, Upper pre-school take part in the Blackpool tooth brushing scheme. Upper pre-school may also take part in the Pre-school council where they are given the responsibility to make decisions about their learning and environment.

#### **PEDAGOGY**

Our curriculum has been carefully planned to ensure our children receive a broad, balanced and ambitious offer.

Pedagogy is a technical term for all the ways practitioners help children learn and how they teach them. We recognise that all children are different, and therefore, a variety of approaches are required. These include:

- Creating a rich and stimulating environment both indoors and outdoors so that children can choose their own play and activities.
- Joining in with children's play when appropriate and sensitively introducing challenges and new ideas.
- Setting challenges for children sensitively and allowing them to find their own solutions to problems.
- Showing children how to do things (modelling) and explaining how to do things.
- Encouraging children to collaborate and learn from each other.
- Guiding children's learning in a playful way.
- Discussing ideas with children, using skillful questioning and challenging their thinking to help them clarify their understanding of ideas.
- Commenting on what children are doing.
- Directly teaching children a new skill, concept, or an important piece of information.
- Using ICT to support children's learning, using the approaches set out above.









#### **CURRICULUM**

Our curriculum offer meets The Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Four guiding principles should shape practice in early years settings. These are:

- every child is a unique child who is constantly learning and can be resilient, capable, confident, and self-assured
- children learn to be strong and independent through positive relationships
- children learn and develop well in enabling environments with teaching and support from adults, who respond to their individual interests and needs and help them to build their learning over time. Children benefit from a strong partnership between practitioners and parents, and/or carers
- importance of learning and development. Children develop and learn at different rates. The framework covers the education and care of all children in early years provision, including children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)

We believe in a consistent approach where each and every practitioner enjoys spending time with the children in their care. A close partnership with parents ensures we work together to provide the very best care for our youngest children.

Seven areas of learning and development must shape educational programmes in early years settings. All areas of learning and development are important and inter-connected.

Three areas are particularly important for building a foundation for igniting children's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning, forming relationships, and thriving. These are the prime areas:

- communication and language physical development
- personal, social, and emotional development

Providers must also support children in four specific areas, through which the three prime areas are strengthened and applied. The specific areas are:

- literacy
- mathematics
- understanding the world
- expressive arts and design











#### **OUTDOOR PLAY**

We have significantly improved our outdoor provision and are very proud of what we have to offer our youngest children.

Under our canopy, you will find children engaged in mixing, crushing, measuring, floating, chopping, mark-making, and much more. Walk around the corner and see children improving their gross motor skills on our newly installed climbing apparatus.

We play outside every day, whatever the weather!

Waterproofs are available for children to wear to ensure they remain dry (mostly!) and warm during their time outdoors.


Learning is a messy job!
